

**A report on the sensitization Programme on Financial Frauds for
faculty members and students.**

The IQAC of Lumding College had conducted an awareness programme on financial frauds for faculty members and undergraduate students of Lumding College on March 22, 2017 in collaboration with the Dept of Non Banking Supervision (DNBS), RBI, Guwahati. A total no. of 174 participants took part in the programme. Sri Saugata Chakraborty, Assistant General Manager, RBI Guwahati, conducted the programme. He dwelt at length on the menace of financial exploitation of common people by fraudsters employing various means, including to a great extent the use of cyber technology in recent times. He emphatically suggested to be extremely cautious before investing in any concern and not be carried away by their propaganda who aim at hood- winking the investors with their high sounding false assurances of huge return in future. He observed that creating financial awareness among the teaching and student community is one of the key factors that contribute to the prevention of such frauds as the knowledge shared can spread rapidly through word of mouth. He elaborated on the various ways and means of prevention of the financial frauds. The programme raised a lot of awareness among the teachers and the students about the financial exploitation by the fraudsters.



Report on Earthquake and Fire Mock Drill.

The IQAC of Lumding College had initiated college level Earthquake and fire Mock Drill conducted by District Disaster Management Authority, Nagaon District in association with Indian Red cross society, Nagaon District branch on 23/03/2017 in the college campus. A total no. of 101 students were activity involved in the entire Mock Drill process besides 22 teachers. Sri Lakshman Prasad Barthakur, IRCS, NDB, lecturer of Emergency First Aid, British St. John Ambulance Association was there to lead the entire Mock Drill Process. A total no of 23 fire extinguishers were examined and their types sorted out. A power point presentation by the Resource Personal was self explanative and offered many tips in the management of disaster. Additional observers like Sri Simnath Borah demonstrated the earthquake and fire management process. A mock fire alarm too was sounded to generate alertness and awareness amidst the students in any such eventuality. A few suggestions and recommendations were made by the team for updating the equipments and the relevant information from the concerned departments like NDRT, ADB and DDMA.



Cleanliness drive and development of Infra-structure programme:

A cleanliness drive was organized by NSS unit, Lumding College at **Vivekananda Shiksha Niketan, Guru Basti, Lumding** on 25.03.17. The NSS unit comprising of 17 teachers and 97 students actively participated in distributing the stationary materials such as blackboards, books etc.to the students keeping in mind their right to access quality education.

Report on Aids Awareness Programme:

In order to mark awareness about AIDS, the NSS unit of Lumding College had carried several programmes in **Hatikhali N.C.L.P School, Sastri Gaon Lumding** on 29.03.17. Quiz competitions, lecture sessions and discussions formed crucial part of these programmes. The session was attended by 15 teachers and 87 students and was accompanied by Dr. Krishna Das to enhance the knowledge on the above subject. A Report on free medical camp

Keeping in view the increased mortality rate and casualty due to lack of medical amenities in the peripheral areas of the town as well as in the backward areas, the Indian Medical Association (IMA) unit of Lumding had organized a free medical camp on 21st May 2015 at swami Vivekananda school at Shastri Gaon in collaboration with NSS unit of Lumding College. Around 21 teachers and 72 students and volunteers took part in the programme which aimed at providing free health check up of the patients incapable of mobility and distributing basic medicines and First AID kits to the people of the locality. Around 250 people were given free medical consultancy and drugs. Besides, the members of the NSS unit and IMA briefed and trained the villagers about the basic hygiene methods for both men and women. The camp aimed chiefly at child ailments and their immunity issues. The camp was rounded off to the utmost satisfaction and benefit of all concerned.

A Report on the Malaria Awareness Programme

The Extension Cell of Lumding College in association with Indian Medical Association had organised a one day Programme on 'Malaria Awareness' among the students and faculties of Lumding College on 10th June, 2014.
